There is widespread discontent amongst members... with NHS England's direction regarding workforce issues, and whilst the College has made efforts to listen to members' concerns, we do not feel that this has translated into meaningful tangible action. As such, we have been working in recent weeks to draft motions, and we are seeking to discuss the following with the College, ultimately to exert direct pressure on NHS England

Anaesthesia Associate Expansion

to resolve the following issues:

The proposed expansion of Anaesthetic Associates (AAs) to 2000 as outlined in the Government's Long Term NHS Workforce Plan, to which we are strongly opposed. We seek the College to formally adopt the position of opposition to AA expansion.

Rotational Training

The impact of rotational training on doctors' morale, mental health, integration in the workplace, and family life outside of work.

Recruitment Reform

Consideration of regional recruitment systems to replace the Anaesthetic National Recruitment Office (ANRO), following the systemic failures outlined in the Significant Incident Report of December 2021.

Finally, we urge the College to adopt a stronger stance against AA expansion in line with the prevailing opinions of members, and to better represent the interests of anaesthetists in the face of ostensibly anti-doctor Government policy.
